Saint Mary's University, or SMU as we are more commonly known, is one of 3 universities located in the greater Halifax area (as close as you can get to the Atlantic ocean without going for a swim) and has been in operation for over 200 years. The Psychology department at SMU is one of its star attractions! Located within the Faculty of Science the Psychology department has over 38 full- and part-time faculty members, approximately 600 undergraduates and 22 full-time graduate students. At the undergraduate level SMU offers students over 50 different courses covering a variety of topics that are sure to meet the needs of students completing a major, minor or area of concentration in psychology. The psychology department at SMU offers students the option of completing a degree in psychology as a Bachelor of Arts or Science with the option of completing a Certificate in Human Resource Management. SMU is also very pleased to let students know that Psychology has recently been added to the list of departments that offer an undergraduate Co-op program. Undergrads are also encouraged to continue their education by applying to complete a terminal Masters of Science in Applied Psychology.

At the graduate level SMU offers an applied science programs in Industrial/Organizational Psychology. The department has the highest number of I/O faculty in any program in Canada. The graduate program offers students various opportunities to put their skills into practice through applied coursework in areas such as organisational psychology, engineering psychology, personnel selection, training and development as well as the opportunity to complete a summer internship. Graduate students applying to SMU need not worry about funding, as students are provided with a student scholarship and a teaching assistantship.

Opportunity abounds at SMU for both undergraduates and graduates. With the CN Centre for Occupational Health and Safety and the Centre for Leadership Excellence there are plenty of opportunities for undergraduate and graduates to become involved in research. With both the undergraduate and graduate societies hard at work there are plenty of social occasions such as the annual Holiday social, and Wine and Cheese socials. Last but not least, there is the Annual SMU Student Psychology Conference where students have the opportunity to present their research, listen to guest speakers and socialise with faculty and other students.
