Qualifications: PhD in psychology from a university of recognized standing; registration as a psychologist with the College of Psychologists of Ontario; knowledge of theories and practices of psychology, current rehabilitative, treatment and assessment techniques, practices and theories applicable to male and female youth to provide psychological assessment, treatment and consultation; knowledge of program evaluation and research techniques to evaluate program effectiveness and develop/conduct research projects; knowledge of professional standards of practice and relevant legislation such as consent to treatment, care and retention of records, Regulated Health Professions Act, Mental Health Act, privacy legislation and limits to privacy/confidentiality; analytical and problem-solving skills to provide diagnostic assessments, to formulate/deliver/evaluate treatment, crisis intervention and rehabilitation plans/programs in a multidisciplinary setting, and to develop/conduct/participate in research; interpersonal skills to maintain strong working relationships with multidisciplinary team members and to provide therapy to youth; strong communication skills to communicate information regarding psychological assessment approaches and findings, and treatment/rehabilitative activities to stakeholders, conduct therapy and counselling sessions, assist in professional supervision of students, and participate in staff training; knowledge of/ability to operate personal computer programs (e.g., word processing, databases, e-mail, Internet) to oversee the administration/scoring of psychological tests and prepare reports. Less qualified applicants may be considered on an underfill basis.
