The Position:

The incumbent will offer a wide range of services within a broad band of health and social services. The Psychologist will also offer consultation and supervision to other staff and non-registered psychology staff and will be expected to work closely with other team members to plan, implement and evaluate treatment and behavioural plans for the individuals we support.

This is a full time position and would be ideal for an early career psychologist interested in learning and developing clinical skills and experience in the field of intellectual/developmental disabilities. Candidates with experience with child and adolescent population are encouraged to apply.

Candidates would ideally be located in and operate out of our Windsor, Chatham or London offices. Some travel will be required.

Qualifications:

- Masters or Ph.D. degree in Psychology
- Registered or eligible for registration with the College of Psychologists of Ontario
