We are seeking a full-time, regular Psychometrist for the Autism Program. The Psychometrist will work as an integral member of the Clinical Team conducting a variety of psychometric assessments on children with Autism Spectrum Disorder. We will also consider a Psychological Associate who is registered with the College of Psychologists of Ontario for this position.

The successful candidate will work from either the Windsor or the London office and regular travel will be required within Southwestern Ontario.

Responsibilities:

Under the supervision of the Clinical Director, the Psychometrist will:

- Conduct regular adaptive and cognitive assessments on children with ASD to assess on-going progress before, during and after treatment
- Complete assessments to gather data regarding eligibility for intensive behaviour intervention (IBI) programming
- Analyze results of tests and complete reports in a timely manner with high accuracy
- Share results with parents and caregivers in a caring and supportive fashion

Qualifications:

- Masters degree in Psychology from a recognized university
- A minimum of 2 years of supervised psychometric practice preferably in a clinical or outpatient setting or educational program
- Familiarity with the CARS, Vineland, SB5, Mullen Scales and WPPSI-III is an asset
- Experience in testing children with Autism Spectrum Disorders
- Advanced knowledge of child development and the impact of autism on the development of behavioural, communication and social skills in children with autism
- Highly developed interpersonal and communication skills
- Works well as part of multi-disciplinary team
- Flexible, self-motivated, mature consistent approach
- Possess a valid Ontario driver's licence and have access to a vehicle
- Must have computer software skills including word processing and email
