



## Canada Research Chair

### In Psychological Health and Wellbeing

The Department of Psychology at Bishop's University in Sherbrooke, Quebec, invites applications for a Tier II Canada Research Chair (CRC) in the field of Psychological Health and Wellbeing. The CRC program was created by the Government of Canada to cultivate world-class research and development. Applicants for this tenure-track position should possess a strong research profile and the demonstrated ability to obtain external funding in a field directly related to Psychological Health and Wellbeing. In accordance with the goal of the CRC program, applicants should show evident potential to emerge as an internationally recognized scholar. Teaching duties will be two courses per academic year. The appointment will be made in the Department of Psychology, with the expectation that the appointee will contribute to the design and development of a graduate program in Psychology, and potentially take part in current interdisciplinary programs in Sports Studies, Psychology / Human Resources, or Neuropsychology. Cross-appointments to these programs may be possible if applicants are interested.

We encourage applications from any area of Applied Psychology, as long as research is focused on issues directly relevant to the Psychological Health and Wellbeing of individuals and/or communities. The successful candidate will join and contribute to the emerging research group on Psychological Health and Wellbeing that regroups several researchers from Psychology and related fields (e.g. Human Resources, Biology and Sociology). As such, the ability to generate and lead large-scale projects that span interdisciplinary lines is a definite asset.

Normally, the Tier II CRC competition is open to candidates who are within a maximum of ten years from their terminal degree (Ph.D. or equivalent) at the time of nomination. The CRC will be awarded for a 5-year period, renewable once.

In accordance with Canadian immigration requirements, priority will be given to Canadian citizens and permanent residents. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply. Bishop's University is committed to employment equity and encourages applications from women, aboriginal people, people with disabilities and visible minorities.

Applicants should provide a letter of intent, a current curriculum vitae, a statement of research achievements and future objectives, evidence of teaching effectiveness and at least three letters of reference to:
