Classified as Research psychologist, the purpose of the position is to design, direct, provide, and supervise a structured clinical program within one of our service areas. You will also conduct cutting-edge clinical evaluative research and program evaluations of our DBT programming, ensuring staff competencies to model standards and supervise evidence-based or best practice clinical services. The clinical service area remains open, as we desire the recruitment of a strong DBT Leader who might best direct program improvement in any of our core service areas while acting as consultant to leaders in other programs.
