Psy.D. Degree Program

School Information: Founded in 1952, the Adler School of Professional Psychology is the oldest independent school of psychology in North America with campuses in Chicago and Vancouver. The school offers an APA-accredited clinical psychology doctoral program and several degree programs at its Chicago location; at its Vancouver location, the school has also developed a clinical psychology doctoral program (PsyD) and has several Master degrees. The Vancouver Campus of the Adler School operates in British Columbia under the consent of the BC Ministry of Advanced Education, which has recently provided consent to launch the Doctor of Psychology in Clinical Psychology (Psy.D.) degree program. As part of its commitment to continue the work of Alfred Adler, the School trains practitioners with interest in social justice to work with marginalized and underserved populations.

Position Summary: The responsibilities of a Core Faculty position include teaching a variety of courses in areas of expertise, providing student advising, clinical supervision of students in practica, supervision of doctoral research projects, committee work, and participating in curriculum oversight and development.

Candidates with expertise in the following subject areas will be given particular consideration:

Biological Bases of Behaviour

Research Methods/Statistics

Adlerian Theory & Methods

Clinical Assessment (including projective assessment)

Work schedule: This position is designed around a four-day contract but may have some flexibility depending upon the interests and qualifications of the candidate.

Minimum Qualifications:

- A Doctorate in Psychology (preferably in clinical psychology) from a program accredited by CPA or its equivalent.
- Psychologist Registration (or registration eligible) with the College of Psychologists of British Columbia (successful registration will be a contract requirement).
- A strong record of clinical experience, graduate level teaching and clinical training (depending upon the stated area of expertise, experience and training will ideally be from the scholar-practitioner model).
- A record of scholarship related to clinical psychology.

- Commitment to training psychologists to work with marginalized and underserved populations (in keeping with the Adler School's emphasis in social justice), Candidates with particular interest in this mission and with demonstrated experience in these areas are preferred.
- Must pass a pre-employment background check.
