Responsibilities include (but are not limited to):

- Conduct various assessments, interventions and counseling based on in house and community need.
- Score and interpret assessment results and determine goal areas
- Collaborate with a multidisciplinary team to determine child's areas of strengths and needs
- Share assessment results with a multidisciplinary team
- Utilize the Seattle Washington's 4 digit code in collaboration with a pediatrician to diagnose Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders.
- Share assessment results with caregiver/parents and other individuals
- Summarize assessment results and recommendations in a formal report
- Provide strategies and suggestions to caregivers/parents, teachers, physicians and other individuals on how to meet the children's needs
- Coach and provide counseling to caregivers/parents and other relevant individuals on developmentally appropriate activities, strategies, and review the progress and effectiveness of the same
- Develop behaviour support plans and social stories, and support staff and/or caregivers/parents on the implementation
- Complete referrals to outside agencies
- Consult with colleagues external to Renfrew Educational Services
- Collaborate with team members; develop and present in-services to staff and caregivers/parents; assist within the home regarding the implementation of behaviour support; plan and prepare programming for implementation; consult with colleagues external to Renfrew Educational Services
- Represent Renfrew in the community (inter-agency meetings, professional organizations, job fairs)
- Complete monthly statistics forms
- Travel to locations within one hour of Calgary (e.g. High River, Canmore, Siksika)

Qualifications:

- Master's degree in psychology and current registration with the College of Alberta Psychologists
- Experience working with children with special needs and their families
- Familiarity with the Canadian Code of Ethics for Psychologists, Code of Professional Conduct, Principles for Psychological Testing, Family Enhancement Act, Mental Health Act, Persons with Disabilities Act
- Knowledge of Developmentally Appropriate Practices
- A good listener, with strong verbal and written communication skills
- Organized with good planning/time management and problem solving skills
- Experience with assessment, intervention and counseling in numerous areas (Autism, FASD, psychoeducational, social/emotional, behavioural, Learning Disabilities etc.)
- Experience with the Seattle Washington 4 Digit Code or willingness to learn
- Must have a vehicle, valid Alberta Driver's License, and a clean driving record
