The Clinical Psychologist will report to the Executive Director of Operations and be responsible for assessments, diagnosis, developing and overseeing behaviour plans and supports and program management.

The incumbent must demonstrate advanced clinical skills in assessment, analytical/critical thinking, organizational skills, leadership, supervision and oral/written communication skills. Personal attributes will include flexibility, self-awareness and the ability to work as part of a collaborative team and establish, and maintain effective working relationships.

Qualifications

- Doctoral degree or Master of Psychology in Clinical Psychology from an educational institution acceptable to the Nova Scotia Board of Examiners in Psychology;
- Registered, or eligible for registration, with the Nova Scotia Board of Examiners in Psychology;
- Clinical experience conducting and interpreting assessments and implementing evidence-based applied behaviour analysis and intervention for adults with intellectual disabilities and neurodevelopmental disorders or dual disorders;
- Specialized training in Applied Behaviour Analysis, Positive Behaviour Support Planning, and developing individualized support plans;
- Demonstrated competence with the DSM classification system, formal diagnosis of mental disorders and with the use and interpretation of psychological assessment tools;
- Experience in the development of effective linkages with other health, social service and community agencies as appropriate;
- Demonstrated competence supervising and/or training clinicians in evidence-based treatment approaches;
- Demonstrated ability to work independently and collaboratively with interdisciplinary teams and community partners is essential;
- Training or experience in crisis intervention and suicide risk assessment;
- Willing to participate in clinical training activities;
- Valid driver's license and access to reliable transportation;
- Physical ability to perform the duties of the position;
- Good attendance and work record;
- Clear criminal record check.
