Applicants must have a PhD in Counselling Psychology from a major research university (or be within 6 months of completion of their doctorate). Expertise in any one of the areas of couples/family counselling, career counselling, or school counselling would be an asset. Eligibility for registration as a psychologist in the province of Alberta is a requirement.

We are seeking applicants who have balanced strengths in research and clinical practice. The successful candidate will be expected to teach courses in counselling psychology, such as practicum courses, develop or continue an active program of research, supervise graduate student theses and doctoral dissertations, seek research grant funding, establish strong links with community partners, and serve on committees.
